

VETTING CONSIDERATIONS

EQUIP Leadership uses the following analysis questions in vetting Alliance Partnerships and proposed projects:

Partnership

Will the Alliance Partner agree to a collaborative and mutually beneficial partnership with EQUIP?

Intentionally Evangelistic

Is there a thoughtful, deliberate effort to make an appropriate Christian outreach?

Leverage

Does the Alliance Partnership create the opportunity for a greater impact than either partner could achieve on their own?

Accountability

Does the Alliance Partner show a willingness to be accountable? Does the organization or movement have the staff and systems to be accountable regarding the project? Is accountability part of the culture?

Leadership

Are the leaders intensely committed to their work and to this project? Do they show a proven track record of action? Do they have a clear vision of what is to be achieved and how they want to achieve it?

Measurable Outcomes

Does the project identify changes in people, and quantify them – at least as estimates of what will be achieved? Does management go beyond listing activities to identify the impact expected through those activities?

Financial Support & Capacity

Does the Alliance Partner have a history of financial stability? Does it have the financial systems and people in place to ensure sound management of the project funding?

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
